Nevertheless, it has survived 22 termination attempts in NASA funding bills since 1991. Other NASA issues are whether NASA is adequately managing its flight programs, ensuring the safe operation of the space shuttle, effectively developing new launch vehicles, and facilitating space commer- cialization. NASA requested \$14.04 billion for FY2001 and Congress approved \$14.25 bil- lion. The FY2002 request was \$14.5 billion; Congress approved \$14.8 billion.
